From the Principals Pen...

Term 3 has flown by in a blur! It really is hard to believe that we are three quarters of the way through this school year. I am so proud of our school community students have continued to grow and shine so eager this week to complete assessment to gauge their progress... wonderfully motivated learners! This week saw the installation of our Storybook Staircase... a wonderful addition to our school that makes me smile EVERY time I look at it. As well as representing Millewa and the books they have enjoyed personally or as a class, it was lovely to hear students from Mudgee talking about the books they recognized, the ones that had been read to them at home and the ones they wanted to read when they were older - fabulous to see our younger students aspiring to be strong readers (and they are working at it every day!)

Over the holidays, our Ramps project will commence. This is a \$300,000 project made possible with funding by the VSBA (Victorian Schools Building Association) over 3 stages to enhance our school further making it accessible to people with mobility issues. Stage 1 will include the student toilets – a ramp from the back of the admin building zig zagging to meet the student toilets. Stage 2 will be decreasing the gradient of the existing ramp near the front office, which will also involve removing one side of the stairs leading to the office. Stage 3 will be the biggest! It involves access from the front of the school with a whole new entry to the school with two ramps (one at the entrance and one at the top where the existing garden is) linked with a new wider path to meet the existing stairs up to the office... it will be amazing but will require some modifications and disruptions over term 4 – I will work with the Project Manager to ensure disruptions have minimal impact of teaching and learning.






