From the Principals Pen...

As educators, our role is not only to care for students and ensure we teach them the components of the Victorian Curriculum, but to also ensure students have a voice in what they learn and how they learn it. This week we held the first part of our Student Forums in preparation for planning days next week. Students worked in their leadership groups to brainstorm ideas of topics/interests that they'd love to explore further through Integrated Studies in Term 4. Although this was planned for 3-6, the opportunity presented itself to bring all students together for this process. Once brainstorming had happened, each group determined what their top 3 suggestions were. These ideas were shared with the whole group. Every student voted on what their favourite topic was out of the 8. When we realised we had a tie, the students who voted for the outlying topics got to vote again for one of the top 4 topics. This process allowed us to determine the Bethanga top 3. On Thursday (after the newsletter is printed!), students in grade 5 and 6 will join senior students from other cluster schools via WebEx to pitch their top 3 topics. These representative students will then vote to determine our focus for term 4.

Student voice comes through in a daily basis in regards to choosing the ways to present information, choosing what to write about, ways to work to support learning styles etc. This student forum however is a great way of illustrating to families what Student Voice is and how students are given the opportunity to have their say about what they learn... they are now waiting with baited breath for the outcome!




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








Maths

We have been learning about multiplication for the past few weeks. We have explored numerous strategies we can apply to solve multiplication problems. The students have shared some really interesting and mathematically sound ideas with the rest of the class. We are also continuing to work on our automatic recall of multiplication facts, related division facts and some students are even working towards automatic recall of squared numbers and square roots.









Literacy

We have been doing so much with our reading and writing skills throughout this term. We have explored numerous non-fiction texts pertaining to Sustainability and have been focused on honing the skill of finding the main point and any supporting detail within a text. Additionally, we have been extending our skills in answering a comprehension question by exploring the RACE Strategy-Rewrite, Answer, Cite, Extend. Hopefully this will help us to delve a bit deeper into articles and texts that we read and then make responses about.









Sustainability

This week we started our Karaoke Project for Sustainability. Students have been put in groups of four and have been tasked with creating a well-written and creative parody of a song which will communicate their knowledge of our Sustainability focus. 







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
