### From the Principals Pen...

I am really unsure of where this year has gone... it genuinely is flying! Planning is happening for 2023. Our classroom structure will remain the same with Mudgee being F-2 and Millewa being 3-6. Mrs Smith and Mrs Grove will continue as teachers in Mudgee. I will be in Millewa part time and we are in the midst of the recruitment process for a teacher to share Millewa with me.

An addition to our Curriculum next year is a Wellbeing Teacher. This has been made possible thanks to the Department of Educations focus on Student Health and Wellbeing, passed on to schools as extra funding to facilitate staffing and programs to support students and enhance their mental health.

Our Wellbeing Teacher will work two days a week, aspects that they will cover over a fortnightly timetable include:

- Intervention and Extension (The Tutor Learning Initiative in addition to Georgie who will continue this in 2023)
- Creative Arts drama, dance and music
- Sport Specific Skill Development
- Leadership and Student Voice
- Social Groups and 1:1 support where need is identified.

I am thrilled to announce that Mrs Genn Hamam will be our Wellbeing Teacher in 2023! Her passion for our school and students is already evident and with previous experience with both sporting programs and drama.... She is the perfect fit! I feel very grateful for the amazing team of staff we have at Bethanga Primary.

Students, Teaching and Learning is always our core work. As we come to the 'pointy end' of the year, focus is on ensuring students have a solid understanding of concepts taught and can generalise their knowledge. Supports are put in place to ensure that all students have the optimal growth... we always strive for 12 months+ growth in a 12-month period no matter what their starting point is. End of year assessment will commence in coming weeks to support the writing of Student Reports as well as reflecting on achievement levels for learning goals set in Individual Support Plans (SSG Meetings will occur in week 10, invitations for these meetings will go out to relevant families in coming weeks).

On Monday, we have a Student Free Day. This Curriculum Day is an opportunity for staff to come together to work collaboratively on a common goal and participate in Professional Development.

Our focus on Monday will be on -

- Creating an 'Instructional Model'. Teaching in both Millewa and Mudgee is very specific and aligns with the Victorian Curriculum. The idea of an Instructional Model is that it outlines the 'how' we teach so that there is consistency in structure F-6. This also embeds expectations to support any new staff that come to our school.
- Auditing our Assessment Schedule ensuring that every assessment item has purpose and guides planning and instruction at students point of need.
- Revising our Numeracy Scope & Sequence. A Scope & Sequence is a document that outlines the order in which concepts or topics are taught to ensure everything required in the Victorian Curriculum is addressed appropriately. We are revising the document we currently use to ensure it is developmentally appropriate and that concepts align to support the HITS (High Impact Teaching Strategy) of multiple exposures. For example, linking decimals, fractions and money allows for an integrated approach to teaching these concepts with real life application.

It will be a big day but we are super excited to have this opportunity to work collaboratively on these vital guiding documents to ensure we continue to improve and always work at the high level we strive for


I hope all of our families have a wonderful long (long!) weekend, school will be back next Wednesday (3)

We know that information writing needs:


- To inform the reader

- To have labelled diagrams









