It really is wonderful to see students having a say in what happens at their school both in the classroom and in the grounds!






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## **Writing in Millewa**


Throughout the past few weeks, students in Millewa have been very busy producing a Historical Recount on a famous explorer or exploration, following the 'Writing Process'.




We initially delved into the purpose, text structure and language features of the historical recount genre in order to give us a good foundation on which to write about our chosen topic. Next, we commenced a BRAINSTORM, although most students already had a good idea as to what it was they wanted to write about. We then began the RESEARCH & NOTE TAKING phase in order to gain a sound understanding of our different topics. This phase took a bit of time as we then had to PLAN our paragraphs, with topic headings, and sort our notes into corresponding ideas. Afterwards, we began DRAFTING our writing, drawing from our notes, our understanding of the text structure and our exploration of the language needed to communicate for this genre of writing. Once our draft was complete, we moved into EDITING. We had to self-edit, peer edit and teacher edit, with each editor using a different coloured pen. We discussed how this phase was the one that could turn a good piece of writing into an exceptional piece of writing. Adding more information, descriptive language and improving sentence structure was a big focus. Next, we CONFERENCED with Mrs Hamam. Here, we had the opportunity to explore our topic and have her help us by modelling how we revise and edit our work, one on one. The final phase, PUBLISHING, where most of us are at now, is the part where we type out our finished copy. Some amazing writers have emerged. Watch this space!



















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# Transition at Bethanga Primary School
