


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PLAYGROUND CHANGES

At the end of Term 1, we completed a whole school playground audit. This was a way of engaging Student Voice to identify where students liked to play at breaks at the same time as identifying where they believed issues/arguments/unkind words occurred. I was really impressed with the thoughtfulness our students demonstrated in completing this activity.







Key points to come out of the audit were:

- All areas in our yard are utilised as valued play spaces by our students
- Students believe it can be hard to find a teacher when they need help at breaks if they are at the other side of the school
- The same places that were identified as the favourite places to play, were also the ones where issues occurred.

In response to this, we have commenced Term 2 with some changes:

- √ To ensure yard duty teachers are readily on hand when needed, we have halved the area they need to supervise. To do this, we have essentially split the school in half, the 'top half' is where everyone plays at recess and the 'bottom half' is where everyone plays at lunch.
- We have introduced toilet passes, office passes and first aid passes so that students check in with teachers before entering buildings (or helping themselves to ice packs without first aid attention from an adult first). This also minimises students near toilets making this a quiet, private space for going to the toilet only
- We have painted over the old down ball court and created some where interactive play spaces with a 'rainbow serpent' and hop scotch (other features to be added this term)
- The Fairy garden was moved so that it is more visible and the area it was previously is now out of bounds.

The response to these changes by both students and teachers has been really positive so far. I loved being out in the yard this week and being able to check in with all students in a smaller space – it had a wonderful 'feel' in the yard and encouraged a lot of cross over of play.


















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
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ANZAC EXHIBITION

Building a national picture of child health

From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school. The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years. Children don't miss any class time while the AEDC is completed, and parents/carers don't need to supply schools with any new information. The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.

AEDC data is reported at a school, community, state/territory and national level. AEDC results for individual children are not reported and the AEDC is not used as an individual diagnostic tool. Some teachers have found that completing the AEDC made them more aware of the needs of individual children and their class, and that the data was useful for planning for transitions to Year 1 and developing programs. Parents/carers don't need to take any action unless they choose not to include their children in the census.

TRANSITION INFORMATION

Transitioning both in and out of Primary School are significant milestones that require planning to ensure adequate supports are put into place so that these changes are positive. For families with children in grade 6, once you have made the decision as to which Secondary School your child will attend, we ask that you inform us of this so that we can be aware of transition events and make links with the schools to ensure information sharing opportunities are established.

If you or someone you know has a child starting school next year, please let them know that a tour can be organised at any time. For siblings of current students, we will send 2025 enrolment packs home this week, these are due to be returned by 26th July 2024.
